



## **Jonathan Mooney**

### ***The Short Bus – A Journey Beyond Normal***

**In the summer of 2002, Jonathan Mooney bought an old short school bus – the kind that transports students in many school districts to special education classes—and converted it into an RV. For four months, he drove 35,000 miles through 45 states to explore disability culture in America. What surprised him was that this journey led him straight to the myth of normalcy. Jonathan, like many labeled abnormal, spent his life chasing that myth before his trip. But he learned that people with disabilities make up a nation-wide movement that actively resists the constraint of normalcy for all of us.**

**In Jonathan’s presentation he brings to life some of the individuals with disabilities that he encountered on his trip and profiled for his book, *The Short Bus – A Journey Beyond Normal*. Jonathan shows how schools, institutions, and public policy enforce normalcy. He empowers his audience with ideas of resistance and encourages listeners to create an authentic and deeply human definition of themselves and their exceptional children.
