- ***To graduate from Otterbein, students are required to complete 50% or more of their degree at Otterbein. Otterbein requires 120 credit hours to complete the bachelor's degree. In the final semester at Otterbein, students will need to take at least 15 credit hours to meet these requirements. Students should work with their Otterbein advisor to determine what course work will meet this requirement.
- Students must earn a C or higher in all prerequisite course work for the Communication Studies major at Otterbein. Students are encouraged to meet with an Otterbein advisor regarding their major course work and general education course work meant to satisfy Otterbein's general education or INST requirement.

- Students must complete 8-9 hours of disciplinary skills development course work, including one course beyond college mathematics, one course in health and wellness (LFW course) and three courses from: language proficiency, oral and written communication, and experimental design/laboratory skills. Students may use their COMM 1000 (COMM 1105 at Columbus State) for part of this requirement. Students should consult with their Otterbein academic advisor for further options to complete this requirement at Otterbein.
- Students must complete 6 credit hours of COMM department electives. COMM 2232 (COMM 1800 at Otterbein) will count as one departmental elective. Students will select an additional 3 credit hour course at Otterbein from COMM 3400: Persuasion; COMM 3750: Intercultural Communication; COMM 3800: Organizational Communication; or PUBH 3500: Health Education Program Planning and Evaluation. Questions about these courses should be directed to your Otterbein academic advisor.
- **CSCC Degree Plan:** This 2+2 Sample Plan of Study was created using the general plan of study for the Columbus State Associate of Arts degree. Students who are following a specific Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major at Columbus State may utilize this plan for the purposes of transfer and degree planning, but should note that additional course work may be necessary to complete the Columbus State Associate of Arts Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major beyond what is required for the Bachelor of Arts, Major: Health Communication degree at Otterbein University. Additional course work completed as part of Columbus State's Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major may be applied as electives or where appropriate, course work toward the major/minor at Otterbein University.
