- How have you seen these instincts play out when you describe the world around you?



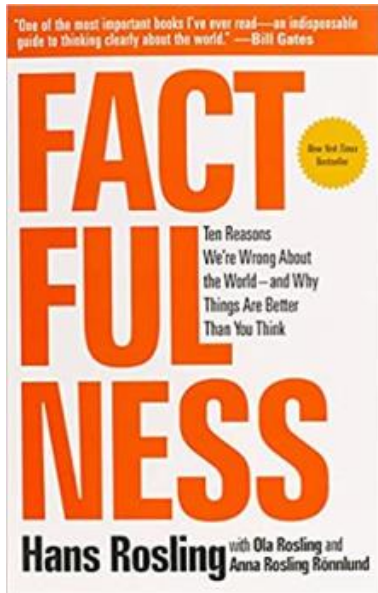

- Have they shifted the way you look at some of the major global challenges we face? How?

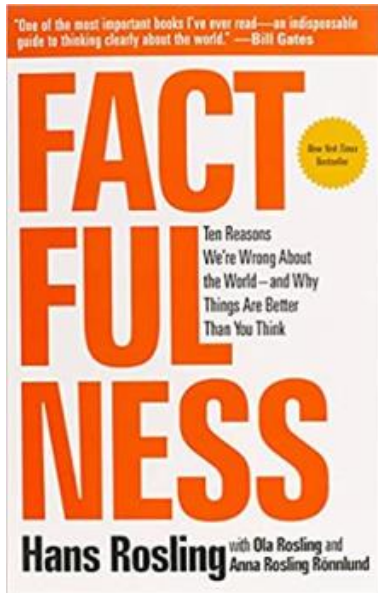

Factfulness Questions?

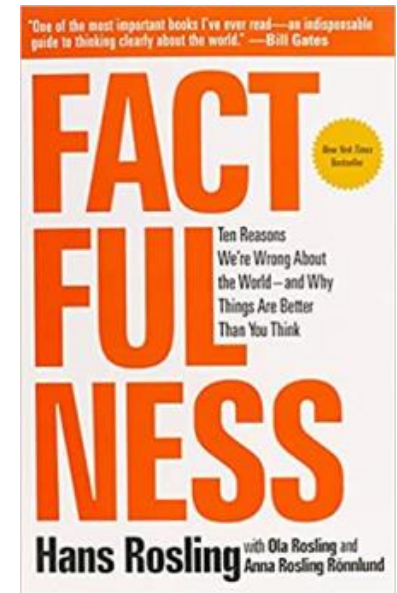
- Why is it so dangerous for business leaders, politicians, and change agents to have such a skewed view of the world?

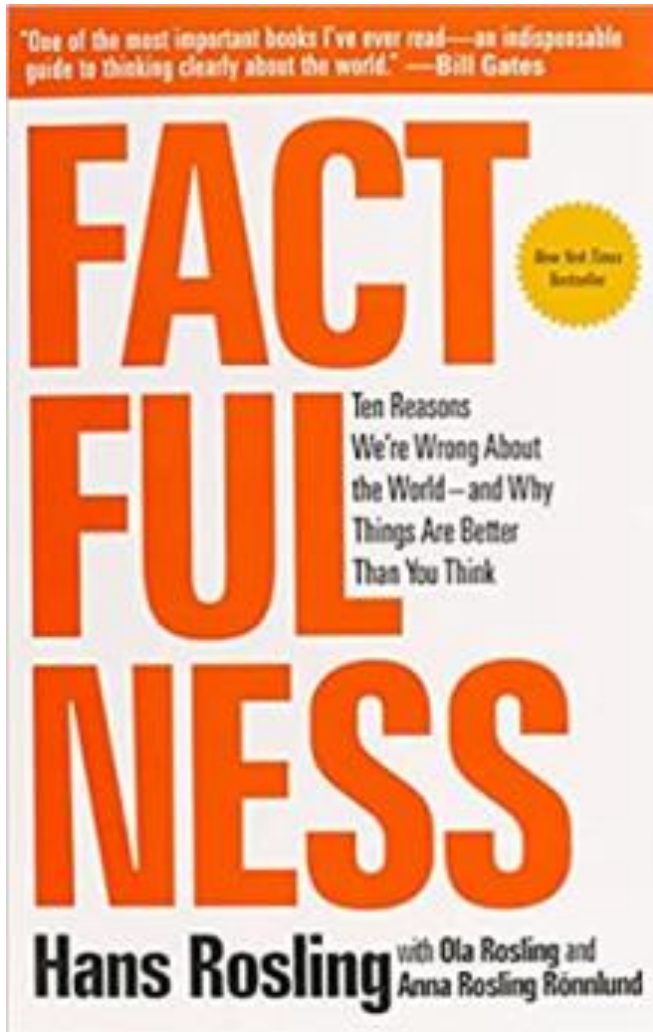
