• At Otterbein, at least 36 credit hours of coursework must be taken in Otterbein classes. Of these hours: at least 9 credit hours must be taken in each of a student's majors at the 3000 level or above, at least 5 credit hours (any level) must be taken in each minor, and at least one INST 2XXX thread course, INST 3XXX, and an SYE course must be taken at Otterbein. Otterbein requires 120 credit hours to complete the bachelor's degree with an overall GPA of 2.0 or higher.

- \*\*Students must earn a C or higher in all prerequisite and major course work for the Sustainability Studies Major (BA) at Otterbein. Classes denoted by the double asterisk are prerequisite/major courses for the Sustainability Studies (BA). Students are encouraged to meet with an Otterbein advisor regarding their major course work and general education course work meant to satisfy Otterbein's general education or INST requirement. Students must complete THREE Writing Intensive (WI) courses to graduate from Otterbein. Columbus State's Composition I and Intermediate Composition courses count as two of three writing intensive courses needed for graduation on this plan. Students will have to complete one additional WI courses at Otterbein and will confer with their Otterbein advisor as to choices available to meet the requirement.
- CSCC Degree Plan: This Sample Plan of Study was created using the general plan of study for the Columbus State Associate of Arts degree. Students who are following a specific Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major at Columbus State may utilize this plan for the purposes of transfer and degree planning, but should note that additional course work may be necessary to complete the Columbus State Associate of Arts Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major beyond what is required for the Bachelor of Arts, Major: Sustainability Studies degree at Otterbein University. Additional course work completed as part of Columbus State's Bachelor's Degree Transfer Major may be applied as electives or where appropriate, course work toward the major/minor at Otterbein University.
- \*\*\*Recommended CSCC Electives: ESSH 1101 and GEOG 2900 are approved elective courses for the Associate of Arts degree and relate to course work required at Otterbein in the Sustainability Studies (BA) major. Students are not required to take these particular courses from the AA Plan of Study. If a student has questions about what courses they may take toward the AA degree, an Arts and Sciences Academic Advisor should be consulted (Union Hall Room 048K). If a certain minor or an additional major is desired to be completed at Otterbein, students should consult with an Otterbein advisor regarding good course recommendations for desired minor and/or major to be completed at Columbus State in preparation for Otterbein.

#### Historical Study [INST 2800]

For the AA degree, students must take one Historical Study course from HIST 1111, 1112, 1181, 1182, 2715, or 2716 to satisfy the CSCC and Otterbein requirements for INST 2800.

# Natural Science [INST 2400]

For the AA degree, students must take two science courses. At least one course must have a lab. Otterbein requires one science course from this list labeled INST 240X. Non-lab courses are indicated by italics. The second course may be completed from elsewhere on this list. BIO 1127 is required for the Otterbein degree and will count as INST 2400 and as a lab course.
