

The Westerville Fire Department is back on campus, this time offering the COVID-19 booster to our campus community! **A booster clinic is scheduled for TOMORROW, Friday, Jan. 14 (details below).**

Please note: This booster clinic will offer the Moderna vaccine, which anyone can receive regardless of the brand of their original vaccines. *According to the CDC, your booster does not have to be the same as the original vaccine you received.*

#### **Why should I get boosted?**

- The booster provides the best protection from serious illness and hospitalization due to COVID-19, including the highly contagious Omicron variant.
- Asymptomatic individuals who have received a booster are not required to quarantine after close contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19. (Otterbein's [new quarantine guidelines](#) follow the CDC recommendations.)

#### **Who can get boosted?**

- Anyone vaccinated with Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna who received their second dose at least five months ago.
- Anyone vaccinated with Johnson & Johnson at least two months ago.

#### **Ready to get a booster?**

##### **Register for the Booster Clinic on Friday, Jan. 14:**

Location: Please enter at the south entrance of the Clements Recreation Center located at 180 Center St. and proceed to the registration stations.

What to do before arriving:

1. Please bring your ID.
2. Bring your vaccination card to get updated with your booster dose.
3. You must wear a mask.
4. Wear clothing that allows easy access to your upper arm.

6. A copy of Westerville Division of Fire's HIPAA policy is available upon request.

\*\*\*Do not schedule an appointment if you meet the below conditions:

1. <18 years old.
2. You are less than 2 months from receiving the JJ vaccine.
3. You are less than 5 months from receiving your second dose of either Pfizer or Moderna.

4. Have had a severe reaction after receiving a vaccine with a component of the Covid-19 vaccine.
5. Have received passive antibody therapy (monoclonal antibodies or convalescent serum) as treatment for Covid-19 in the last 90 days.
6. Have tested positive for Covid-19 in the past 14 days.
