Notes about the Accounting Major

- At Otterbein, at least 36 credit hours of coursework must be taken in Otterbein classes. Of these hours: at least 9 credit hours must be taken in each of a student's majors at the 3000 level or above, at least 5 credit hours (any level) must be taken in each minor, and at least one INST 2XXX thread course, INST 3XXX, and an SYE course must be taken at Otterbein. Otterbein requires 120 credit hours to complete the bachelor's degree with an overall GPA of 2.0 or higher. Students must complete three Writing Intensive courses. Students must complete 8-9 hours of disciplinary skills development course work, including one course beyond college mathematics, one course in health and wellness (LFW course) and three courses from: language proficiency, oral and written communication, and experimental design/laboratory skills
- Integrative Studies: Students completing ENGL 1100 at Columbus State receive credit for INST 1500 (WI) at Otterbein. Students should complete one 2000-level INST course at Columbus State as part of their Humanities requirement. Students will be required to complete the other two from INST 2200, 2600, or 2800 at Otterbein. In addition, students will be required to complete INST 2000 and 2400 at Otterbein. Consult with an academic advisor about these requirements.
- Students are encouraged to meet with an Otterbein advisor regarding their major course work and general education course work meant to satisfy Otterbein's general education or INST requirement.
- **Accounting Major: Students must complete ACCT 1211 [ACCT 2000], ACCT 1212 [ACCT 2100], ACCT 1400 [ACCT 3300], ACCT 2232 [ACCT 4100], ACCT 2250 [ACCT 3000], ACCT 2252 [ACCT 3050], ECON 2200 [ECON 2100], FMGT 2201 [FIN 3400], and LEGL 2064 [BUS 3500] at Columbus State to qualify for Otterbein upper division major course work.
- The Accounting major can only be completed in person on Otterbein's campus in Westerville.
