Reporting Options (Non-Confidential)

Title IX

Title IX staff formally investigates reports of Title IX violations. Conducts informal and formal resolutions. Will provide accommodations whether or not a survivor chooses to make a formal complaint.

Otterbein Police Department

Location for reporting crimes. Professionally trained officers in trauma-informed violent criminal investigations will review multiple reporting options. Reports involving sexual assaults will list the victim/survivor as John or Jane Doe to protect their identity until their cases are presented through the Franklin/Delaware court systems.

You have the right to...

Decide

You determine what support you want and when. You can decide to make an official complaint with Title IX – or not. You can decide to file a police report with OPD – or not.

Supportive Measures

Even without filing a formal complaint, Title IX offers reasonable accommodations for academic needs, emergency housing, etc.

An Advocate

You can have an advocate come with you to file reports to OPD or Title IX, or go with you to the hospital for evidence collection.

Confidentiality

You will have confidentiality in campus alerts and crime logs.

Healing Support

Access to counseling services or the Otterbein Chaplain for continued support and validation.

Security

OPD can issue no contact directives or more security monitoring of key areas.
